Communication is one of the most precious and difficult things for humans to do. If you have ever traveled to a nation that does not speak English then you can understand a little more about this Way Point on our journey.

This is the story of the continuing rebellion of man against the Creator.

I- The Rebel: Gen 10:6;8-10

Our story begins with a leader who lead the people farther away from God. He was the grandson of Ham, great-grandson of Noah. Notice **Genesis 10:6 And the sons of Ham; Cush, and Mizraim, and Phut, and Canaan.**

Genesis 10:8-12 And Cush begat Nimrod: he began to be a mighty one in the earth. 9 He was a mighty hunter before the LORD: wherefore it is said, Even as Nimrod the mighty hunter before the LORD. 10 And the beginning of his kingdom was Babel, and Erech, and Accad, and Calneh, in the land of Shinar.

Fausset's Bible Dictionary says, "The Hebrew name Nimrod means, "let us rebel," given by his contemporaries to Nimrod as one who ever had in his mouth such words to stir up his band to rebellion. Nimrod subverted the existing patriarchal order of society by setting up a chieftainship based on personal valor and maintained by aggression."

This rebellion was more than just an attempt to protect human lives from the increasing hostile animals. It was a willful and satanic steering of men away from the Creator. We still see evidences of this today around us everywhere. How? I am glad you asked.

Henry Morris says:

Willfully leaving the knowledge and worship of the true God and Creator, they began instead to worship the creation. This soon led to pantheism and polytheism and idolatry. How much of this new system of religion came by direct communication with Satan himself we do not know, but there is abundant evidence that all forms of paganism have come originally from the ancient Babylonian religion. The essential identity of the various gods and goddesses of Rome, Greece, India, Egypt, and other nations the original pantheon of the Babylonians is well established."

All of the non-Christian religions have their origin in the pagan roots of Babylon. Many of these pagan deities were identified with the stars and planets as well as sun worshipping. This system of worship brought about what we know as the zodiac with the constellations.

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II- One Language, One Speech: Gen 11:1-2

“And the whole earth was of one language, and of one speech. 2 And it came to pass, as they journeyed from the east, that they found a plain in the land of Shinar; and they dwelt there.” All the humans of the earth could communicate with each other. They migrated from the mountains to the fertile plains of Mesopotamia. Some strongly suggest that this one language was the Hebrew language; others are less certain and say it was probably just in the Semitic family of languages. The strong argument for it being Hebrew is that all the names of men and places of this time have Hebrew meanings. Human speech is a very remarkable thing indeed. While we constantly see programs about how the dolphins, elephants, ants and other creature communicate with calls, chatter, odors and other means, only humans speak.

III- The City and the Tower to Heaven: Gen 11:3-4

“And they said one to another, Go to, let us make brick, and burn them throughly. And they had brick for stone, and slime had they for mortar. 4 And they said, Go to, let us build us a city and a tower, whose top may reach unto heaven; and let us make us a name, lest we be scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth.”

The area in which these events take place is the plains and there was not any building material there. They made bricks from the soil, probably sun baked. They established a settlement in the land of Shinar and built cities.

One need only look at the use of the pronoun in this section to see that the rebellion was humanistic, *let us build us a city and a tower, whose top may reach unto heaven; and let us make us a name...*”

So the city is built and they decide to build a tower. Some have a picture of this tower reaching into outer space and being an attempt to reaching into the throne room of God. This is not an accurate picture.

If you will notice in the KJV of your Bible the words, *“may reach”* are italic meaning they were inserted by the translator for clarity and were not in the original Hebrew text. The NASB has the same type insertion with the words, *“will reach”*, again in italic.

So, what is the meaning of this? Harold Willmington says:

“Archaeology evidence suggests that the Tower of Babel was in reality a building given over to astrology, or the heather worship of the heavens. Among the ruins of ancient Babylon is a building 153 feet high with a 400 foot base. It was constructed of dried bricks in seven stages, to correspond with the known planets to which they were dedicated...These stages were surmounted by a lofty tower, on the summit of which were the signs of the Zodiac.” (p 35)

JV McGee says, “...the sole purpose of this tower was for a rallying place for man.” (p 52)
